ATTENDANCE

In order to improve our school attendance and reach our target of 96%, we need your support with the following –

1. Adhering to the school time and ensure your child arrives at school on time (between 8.50 a.m. and 9.00 a.m.). Children who are late miss vital learning. Late arrivals will be monitored and if your child (ren) are persistently late in arriving at school, we will address this with you to offer any support that may be needed.

2. We will not be authorising the early collection of children in the afternoons unless they need to attend medical appointments. In such circumstances, we would require evidence of the appointment and a request for absence form will need to be completed in advance of the appointment taking place.

3. For any child whose attendance falls below 90%, this is classed as a 'Persistent Absentee child' by the government. Their attendance will be monitored weekly and support offered to work together to improve this for your child (ren). If your child remains a persistent absentee for a long period of time, then you may end up receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice.

4. Please do not book holidays during term time. We cannot authorise these as per government instruction.

5. Finally, please speak to us if you are having any issues with your child (ren) getting up in the mornings, getting dressed, or not wanting to come to school – we can help you! We are always here to listen.
